



Dear **Competitor**,

Thank you for entering your horse in the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event April 21 – 25, 2021.

Your horse's welfare is of paramount importance to our event management team. We have biosecurity measures designed to decrease the risk of introduction and spread of infectious diseases among horses on our show grounds. All participants are expected to cooperate fully with the implementation of these biosecurity procedures.

Please read the 3 documents attached.

1. Biosecurity Notes for Competitors: this document describes our biosecurity policies and your responsibilities with regard to these policies.
2. Declaration of Event Participation
 - a. If you are shipping multiple horses in your van, you can put all of them on one form.
 - b. Please note that you must sign this form and return it to us.
 - c. Please fill in all segments of the form.
3. Daily Temperature Monitoring Log. Please post the Temperature Log on your horse's stall door and record each horse's rectal temperature on the form twice daily. Please notify the Permitted Treating veterinarians Dr. Allen or Dr. Johns, Veterinary Delegate, Dr. Karen Nyrop, The Assistant Veterinary Delegate Dr. Anne Baskett or Veterinary Services Manager, Dr. Catherine Kohn, if one of your horses has a fever (Temperature > 101.5, two or more hours after exercise) and/or shows signs of a potentially infectious disease (cough, nasal discharge, diarrhea etc).

Please note that **you must sign and return 2 of these documents to us prior to entry into the Competition or other Horse Park Stables**. Please give these documents to Catherine Kohn or the veterinarian who performs the Arrival Examination(s) on your horse(s).

As many of you know, this year, Equine Herpes Virus 1 (EHV1) has been detected in multiple horses, some at competitions, in the EU. This virus in association with fever has also been recently detected in a group of horses in Ocala, and in several horses in Woodford County Kentucky. In view of the current level of EHV1 activity, we have modified our stabling plan to provide the safest possible housing for your horses. Horses will occupy 1 side only of each shed row. This plan means that horses will not be housed in back-to-back stalls, and there will be no horses in facing shed rows. Please adhere to this stabling plan. Please do not take your horse to a shed row other than the one to which the horse is assigned.

Because of EHV1 activity among equine athletes at other venues, It is especially important this year that you take your horse's rectal temperature twice daily and record the values on the Temperature Log Sheet that we will provide. Please return the completed log sheet to Catherine Kohn or to the Stable Office before leaving the grounds.

Thank you for making this competition as safe as possible for our horses.
