As the Veterinary Delegate for the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event, I would like to wish all competitors a very warm welcome from the veterinarians. We are all here to care for the health and welfare of your horses.

Biosecurity and Arrival Exam:

- Please read the Biosecurity Documents provided by the event management and the Veterinary Services Manager.
- Arrival Exams and passports will be collected prior to horses entering the stables. Please refer to the **omnibus listing for times and days the horses can arrive and be examined**. Our goal is to check each horse as they enter the stable so that we can identify any horses with significant fevers before they enter the stable. This will decrease the chance of other competition horses being exposed to a febrile horse.
- Please post the Horse Temperature Form provided to you on the front of your horse's stall and record the temperature as it is taken twice a day. Any temperature above 101F should be reported to Dr. Nyrop, Baskett or Kohn immediately please.

Medications for horses:

- If you have any questions regarding medications, please ask Dr. Nyrop, Baskett, Allen or Johns for assistance.
- FEI rules, including medication rules, are in effect one hour before the competition begins until 30 minutes after the competition is completed.
- No medications may be given within 12 hours before the ride time on a given day.
- Treatments must be given in the Treatment stalls unless otherwise decided with the Veterinary Delegates. Treatment stalls are not open when the stable is closed.

Private Treating Veterinarians:

- We ask that the PTV's have an FEI Photo ID, check in with Dr. Nyrop or Dr. Baskett, and complete a permission to enter the Stables Form. Credentials are given in the stable office.

Permitted Equine Physiotherapists:

- We ask that Permitted Equine Therapists have an FEI Photo ID, check in with Dr. Nyrop or Dr. Baskett, and complete a permission to enter the Stables Form. Credentials are given in the stable office.

Should you have any questions regarding your horses during the competition, know that we are here to help in any way we can. Here's to a safe, successful competition to all!
