Officials and Schedule

A list of officials and the event time schedule are included in your packet. Individual starting times for the dressage test will be published one hour following the first horse inspection and will be available from the stable office. Cross-country test start times will be available one hour after the completion of dressage on Friday.

Competitor Briefing

The Competitor Briefing will be held Wednesday, April 21 at 10:00 a.m. in the Covered Arena

Cross-Country Course Open for Inspection

After the competitor briefing on Wednesday, April 21, the course is open for walking and you may walk it at any time.

Horse Inspection

- 3:00 P.M. - Wednesday, April 21 – CCI5*-L First Horse Inspection
- 7:30A.M. - Sunday, April 25 – CCI5*-L and 4*-S Second Horse Inspection
- Will be in numerical order. A tentative list will be posted in the stable office on Wednesday morning.
- Riders with more than one horse may present horses together.

Wednesday and Thursday Stadium Arena Familiarization

Competitors may ride in the arena (not the competition dressage arena) from 3 – 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday following the first horse inspection for those competing on Thursday at 6 p.m. for those competing on Friday.

Stabling

Stabling Access

All horses entered in the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event will be stabled in a fenced enclosure secured 24 hours. Those allowed access:

- Rider
- 1 groom per competing horse
- 3 additional individuals of your choice – this includes trainer, coach, farrier and veterinarian and can be requested in stable office.
- 2 owners as listed on FEI Passport (requested through owner's packet).

A photo ID pass provides access to the regular Competition Stables beginning Tuesday, April 20 at noon. THIS PHOTO ID MUST BE WORN AND NO PERSON WILL BE ADMITTED TO THE STABLE AREA WITHOUT AN OC ISSUED PHOTO ID.

Competitors in the International Barn will wear a different photo ID that also allows access to the domestic competition stables.

Access Checks

Guards will be stationed at the access gates 24/7 and will check photo IDs for authorized access and exit. Horses entering or exiting the stabling enclosure must wear their bridle number. The Stable Security Chief will coordinate stabling security.

ANYONE (rider, groom, owner, friend, etc.) caught entering the Competition Stabling Enclosure by other than the three access gates (i.e. scaling the fence) will be considered in violation of FEI rules. The person responsible (rider) will be issued a warning. If there is a second offense, the rider will be disqualified from the competition and will be required to leave the grounds as will the offending individual.

Night Security

A Chief Security Officer and Patrol Officers are next to the FEI Steward Office and will patrol the entire stable area from

7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Additionally, a night watch person, specifically to check on the horses, will be in the stable areas from 11:00 p.m. to 6 a.m. If you are in the stable area during these hours and do not have your photo ID, a Patrol Officer will summon the Chief Security Officer. Any unauthorized person will be escorted from the Park by Kentucky State Police. Any person objecting to these procedures will be reported to the organizer for disciplinary action.

Stall Card

It is important that you fill out your stall card completely, especially where you are staying and the telephone number where you can be reached, so that you can be contacted if any problems are detected with your horse(s).

International Horses in Isolation Barn

Horses from overseas that wish to return immediately after Land Rover Kentucky to their country of origin are stabled in Barn 5. Access to this barn is restricted. The purpose is to ensure that these horses are not in contact with horses in the U.S. equine population and so do not have to go through a period of quarantine prior to returning home. The restrictions are not those of the U.S. government but of the governments of the home countries of the horses. As you visit, please be sure not to let horse noses touch.

Non-competing horses

All non-competing horses will be stabled outside of the FEI stabling enclosure. These horses must wear a yellow bridle number issued by the stable office, anytime they are out of their stalls. Non-Competing horses may NOT be jumped over practice fences or any other fences on Park grounds, nor may they be ridden in any of the dressage arenas set up with arena fence. You may use the sand pads and the turf areas in the infield of the racetrack. Remember that competitors may use these areas also (by appointment with FEI Stewards), so please give way to them. Please also remember to use the designated horse paths.

Feed

Horse feed, hay, additional stall mats and bedding may be obtained from Dever Hay & Grain, located in the office trailer near Barn 21. If you have special needs, just let them know. You aren't required to purchase feed, hay and bedding from Dever, but this company has the Horse Park Concession. This means that no other dealer may deliver onto the Horse Park grounds. You would have to drive to the other dealer to purchase your item(s).

Manure Handling

Please place stall cleanings in the designated muck piles.

Smoking

IT IS ABSOLUTELY FORBIDDEN TO SMOKE IN ANY OF THE STABLE AREAS OR IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA OUTSIDE THE STABLE.

Bridle Numbers and Pinneys

Displaying Bridle Numbers and Pinneys - FEI rules require you to either WEAR your PINNEY or have the BRIDLE NUMBER ON your competing horse(s) at all times, whether lungeing, mounted or being walked or grazed.

We ask you to **WEAR your PINNEY WHEN WALKING THE COURSE SATURDAY**. Fence judges and mounted stewards can't always distinguish a competitor who is walking the course (and thus legitimately on the track of the course) from a spectator who is in the line of the fence

Bridle Numbers - Bridle numbers do not need to be returned.

Pinneys - Pinney numbers do not need to be returned.

Galloping/Hacking/Schooling

The Role of the FEI Steward

The FEI Chief Steward is an official of the FEI and serves the function for both the organizer and the competitor of monitoring the safety, security and welfare of horses in the stabling, exercising and schooling areas. FEI Stewards assist competitors in their reasonable training needs and assures fairness in the sport for all by ensuring compliance with the rules. The FEI Chief Steward also assists the ground jury, veterinarians and farriers.

All competitors at the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event will be expected to comply with the rules and to follow the directions of the FEI Chief Steward and the FEI Assistant Stewards who will be identified by armbands with "FEI Steward" on them. FEI Assistant Stewards will be posted at the practice jumps. They will spot-check at the lungeing area and at the practice dressage arenas and areas near the stables, at the dressage complex and throughout the hacking and galloping areas.

Feel free to contact the FEI Chief Steward, Eileen Pritchard-Bryan or the FEI Assistant Steward, Fran Cross, located in the mobile office on the east side of the Stable Office if you need help, equipment or have questions.

Lunging

Dressage Practice

Practice dressage arenas will be set up in the Zoetis Schooling Ring and in the double warm-up ring, both with GGT footing.

Two (2) practice arenas will be set up in the warm-up ring adjacent to the Rolex Stadium. These two arenas will be used Thursday and Friday as the final warm-up arena for the next three horses. The Rolex Annex Ring will have one practice arena set up and allow warm up for horses 4-6 to go into the dressage arena. Upon the conclusion of dressage Thursday, these two arenas may be used as practice arenas and will return to restricted arenas Friday.

Route to Rolex Stadium and Warm-Up Rings

The route to the Rolex Stadium Warm-Up Ring and the Stadium is to leave the stables by the east gate and follow the dirt drive behind the Stonelea and Claiborne Arenas to just to the left side of the Claiborne Arena. Enter the High Hope Steeplechase Course. Go past the Steeplechase Barn (black tobacco barn on the hill), past the first opening in the fence. Turn right and travel along the roped route toward the warm-up arena. Signs will direct you.

Galloping

Galloping will be along the north fence line from cross-country warm-up to the Wishing Well next to Marks Lane. This area has been worked and prepared for you. You must schedule a time with the FEI Stewards, as you will cross a road which will need to be manned to stop cars from crossing while you are galloping.

Park West Hacking

Exit the back of stabling and take the designated path towards the Alltech Arena or the path to the start box and go past Alltech from there. There will be signs/markers to guide you. For International Horses, you will need to go down Jay Trump (road to the warm-up arenas across from Barn 5), turn left at the turn-outs and follow the directions noted above.

****For galloping and hacking a location of routes will be posted in the stable office. Please notify the stable office or an FEI Steward when going out for a hack for safety reasons.**

Jump Schools

Only those fences provided by the Organizer may be jumped. Competitors will be required to adhere to the following program for both Cross-Country practice obstacles and Jumping practice obstacles:

- An FEI Assistant Steward must be present at the practice fences during your work.
- Designated times for jump schools will be posted in the stable office. For an arranged time, please sign up in the stable office. DO NOT begin jumping without the FEI Jumping Steward present. Cross-Country schooling is near the start box and is by **appointment only**.
- Sunday for the Jumping Test, the practice fences will be in both warm-up arenas near Rolex Stadium. Course Designer Richard Jeffery will set up this area and will develop the procedure for you to move from the warm-up area to the in-gate. The stewards on duty will direct you.
- Non-competing horses may not be jumped at any time.

Medical/Veterinary/Farrier/Physiotherapists

Medical Needs

The primary facility being used by EEI for medical services is the University of Kentucky Hospital Emergency & Trauma Center and is the facility to be used if necessary while you are OFF the Horse Park grounds. Maps and directions are available in the Stable Office or the Event Information booths. If you have a medical emergency, dial 911.

During the days of the competition, the First Aid Tent across from the intersection of Nina Bonnie Boulevard and Lee Cholak Drive will serve as the medical services headquarters.

Individuals attending The Event and noted on the Medical Information & Consent to Care Form will be called over the P.A. system to come to the First Aid Tent to be advised as to the condition of an injured person and to what hospital the person has been transported. If these individuals need transportation to the hospital and can't arrange it through personal contacts, they should go to the stable office and ask for assistance. Grooms will be located through the Stable Office and advised where to go to retrieve the horse.

Emergency Contact Information and Declaration of Medical Condition

Per FEI Eventing Rules 523.1

- Providing a valid contact information is mandatory for all Athletes. The telephone number of an accompanying person/next-of-kin must be provided to the Event secretary upon arrival (OC and medical officer to ensure all information has been received before the Cross-Country).
- Declaration of medical condition Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who chose to wear an armband should download and fill the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website.

** Medical data carrier (also called "medical identification tag"): small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing, intended to alert paramedics/physicians/first responders that the wearer has an important medical condition.*

Conditions that are relevant include recent head injury, serious past injuries/surgery, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long-term medications and allergies. If in doubt, the Athlete should discuss this with his own treating physician.

Veterinary Needs

A Veterinarian may be summoned through the stable office. Event treating veterinarians are in charge of on-call and on location veterinary needs, including night emergencies. Any veterinarian or physiotherapist requiring access to the stables must meet with the Veterinary Delegate or Assistant Veterinary Delegates before access can be granted. The Stable Office can assist with requests.

Farrier

There will be farriers on grounds as of Monday, April 19. On cross-country day, there will be a farrier stationed at the stables and one in the Vet Box. If your farrier will be on the grounds during the Event, please advise the stable office and have him/her check in at the stable office so that we can put him/her in touch with our chief farrier.

Ice

Ice is provided free of charge for competitors tending their horse(s). Obtain from the stable staff. Use of ice for any other reason will cost \$5.00 per bag. Ice will be provided at the finish of the cross-country by EEI.

Results/Broadcast

Closed-Circuit Television

A closed-circuit television showing the dressage, cross-country and jumping tests will be available in the Land Rover Rider Lounge and stable office all four days of the competition. Additionally, cross-country will be broadcast in the Riders' Hospitality Tent in the Vet Box.

Competition Results

Live scoring will be available on kentuckythreedayevent.com. Additionally, a scoreboard will be maintained at the Stable Office and kept up to date as scores are calculated. Daily results sheets will be delivered to the stable office at the conclusion of each day's activities.

Inquiries, Objections, Complaints, Appeals

Inquiries may be made informally concerning any perceived irregularities or mis-scoring. Advise the Stable Office of an inquiry and the proper official(s) will be contacted via radio. Objections, complaints, or appeals (hereafter termed protests) must be made in writing within the required time with a guarantee of U.S. \$100, made payable to Equestrian Events, Inc., which will be refunded if the protest is upheld. Protests should be addressed to the President of the Ground Jury and delivered to the stable office.

Allowance/Parade of Competitors/Awards/Prize Money

Awards Presentation

If you are in the top 20 places for the CCI5*-L or the top 10 or the CCI4*-S, please stay in the Upper warm-up arena. Awards volunteers will place the ribbon on your horse. Horses will enter the arena and turn left starting with 20th or 10th place and walk around the arena as the places are announced.

If the USEF CCI5*-L National Championship Trophy, the Roger Haller Perpetual Trophy and the USET Pinnacle Cup winner is not the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event winner, this trophy will be presented after the Kentucky Three-Day Event Perpetual Trophy.

Victory gallop will follow the three trophy presentations.

Prize Money

See the official program under "Awards" for the breakdown of prize money for the CCI5*-L. Checks for prize money will be made out IN THE NAME OF ONE OF THE OWNERS OF THE HORSE AS LISTED IN THE FEI PASSPORT. If the Rider is one of the owners, the check will be made out in the name of the rider. During the presentation of ribbons, you will be presented with an envelope that will contain a form to be completed.

The check for prize money will be mailed upon receipt of the form. If you have the information, complete the form and bring it to the stable office and your check will be mailed on Monday following the event.
